ACADEMICS

Academic Dishonesty/Cheating/Plagiarism

Cheating is misrepresenting another person's work as one's own or allowing one's work to be used in successful manner. Students aexpected to perform theorem work. Any situation where student is found to be heating or plagiarizing may result in no credit for the particular test/assignment art deadministrator and parents will be notified of each incidence of cheating. Repeated cheating/plagiarism incidents may result in a failing grade the course and/or administrative imposed consequences and may impact participation in school activities/athletics. Additional consequences will be administered if continued incidents occur.

Brown County Middle School Promotion Policy

The Illinois Promotion and Retention Policy prohibits social promotion. Accordingly, a student shall not be promoted based upon age or any other social reasons. The decision to promote a student to the next grade level shall be based on the successful completion of the curriculum and the requirements as outlined in this policy.

1. A final passing grade (A, B, C, D) in 4 of the 4 core classes (Math, English Language Arts (Literature & Writing), Social Studies, and Science) is required for promotion to the next grade level. A final passing grade will be based on the average score of a core class each quarter.

1Q-50 % 2Q-65% 3Q-50% 4Q-70%. Average final grade-58.75%

- 2. Students not passing at the end of the first semester will be placed on an "At-Risk" list.
- 3. Attempts will be made to monitor and implement strategies to help the child improve his/her grades during the rest of the school year using Response to Intervention (RtI).
- 4. At the end of the third quarter, all students who are not passing will be placed on the final "At Risk" list.

Transfer of Courses – Home Schooled Transfer Students

For homeschooled students transferring into BCMS, credits/course will not be accepted or classes unless they are from accredited programs omeschooled classes taken from middle sched books that are not taken through an accredited program will not receive credit BCSD#1 reserves the right to require students entering directly from a homeschooled educational environment to pass placement/proficiency exams to determine the appropriate grade level and/or courses.

ATTENDANCE

ATTENDANCE/ABSENTEEISM

The Illinois School Code requires: Whoeverhas custody or control of my child between the ages of sevenand seventeen years shall cause such child to attend some public school in the district wherein the child resides tentire time it is in session.

EXCUSED ABSENCES - Excuse & bsence are absence for "valid cause", which include, but are not limited to, the following:

- o PersonallIness(ParentContact):Students are allowed 7 days/occurrences of absence per semester which can be excused with a parent phone call and/or note This includes up to five mental health days* per Public Act 102-0266. If a student reaches seven parent contact absences in a semester-(tapartialurrence or a full day occurrence will both be counted for purposes of personal illness/parent contact days as 1 day of absence all subsequent absences will be considered unexcused.
- o Deathin theimmediate family;
- o Family/homemergency(approvedby administrator/reviewable);
- o Courtappearance (Coudatesareexcusedabsenceis the studenth as a note from the probation of ficer or judge saying they were required to appear in court);
- o Religiousobservances;
- o Parent/Guardiaindicatingstudentis ill (reviewable);
- o Medical (a documented pealth related absence, e., medicalor dental appointments);
- o schoolsanctionedield trips;
- o Armedforcesrecruitervisit or enlistmentrelatedactivity (with official note)
- o Out-of-schoolsuspension(Administrativeremoval from schoolproperty for a school day or portion thereof for violations of school disciplinary policies);
- o In-schoolsuspension in-building administrative eassignment from a classperiod or periods for violations of school disciplinary policies).
- o Administrativeapproval;
- o Prearrangedapproved absenceseprocedurespelow)

NOTE: The above absence are examples of "valid cause" absence is e., absence ited in the Illinois School Code and/or District #1 School Board policy.

PRE-ARRANGED APPROVED ABSENCES -Permission of a pre-arranged absence must be secured in the office at least 3 days in advance of the absence. Pre-may absence could include the following:

- 1) ReligiousProgramof Instructionor Conference- A parent/guardiamustnotify the attendance ffice approximately two weeks before the absences.
- 2) Family-Related/Family Time Absences Parents/guardians should make every attempt to schedule family-related/familytime absences around the school schedule. However, when such trips must be made while sch is in session, an application for papproved family-related actification will be reviewed and considered for

notice is required to pre-range an absence. Schoolwork missed is to be made up according to the classroom teacher's policy.
